## **ORDER**

AND NOW, this \_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2009, upon consideration of the Rehabilitator's Application for Approval of a Suspension of the Payment of Commissions to Insurance Agents and Entry of an Order Enjoining Any Person from Taking Any Action to Interfere with this Court's Suspension Order or to Enforce Rights or Make Claims Any Person May Have Against Penn Treaty Network America Insurance Company for Commissions or Similar Compensation, the supporting Memorandum of Law, and any response thereto, it is hereby ORDERED as follows:

- Treaty Network America Insurance Company ("PTNA") of any commissions or other compensation to any agent, broker or other insurance producer or any successor or assignee on account of any insurance business issued, written, assumed or renewed by PTNA. Such suspension shall commence, without further notice, as soon as the Rehabilitator and PTNA can implement the suspension.
- 2. No interest or penalty shall arise or accrue as a result of the suspension of payments as provided for in this Order.

- 3. All persons, in this Commonwealth or elsewhere, are enjoined and restrained from taking any action to interfere with this Order or enforce or collect upon any right or claim to commissions or other compensation due or alleged to be due to any agent, broker or other insurance producer or any successor or assignee on account of any insurance business issued, written, assumed or renewed by PTNA until such time as subsequently Ordered by this Court.
- 4. Counsel for the Rehabilitator is directed to serve a copy of this Order on the agents of Penn Treaty Network America Insurance Company by first class mail at their last known address as reflected on the books and records of the company and file with this Court an affidavit that such service has been effected.
